- Have completed a draft of MHEET Session 1 that is ready for STABLE review
 - Will walkthrough session 1 for review at the Oct 28th STABLE Meeting
 - Would like feedback by Nov 10th to have time to incorporate any edits
- A team has been working on the Training of Trainers (ToT)
 - Includes Christina Yongue, Kimberly Alexander, Wanda Nicholson, and Jasmine Getrouw-Moore
 - Developing a manual and training for the OB and doula leads who will be conducting the MHEET sessions at the practices
 - Plan to do the training in mid-December
- Christina has been developing the Patient Journey Diagram, which will be a part of MHEET session 2
 - The diagram outlines a patient's journey through pregnancy and the individuals involved in care decisions
 - Real patient stories will be mapped onto the diagram to identify when significant encounters
 happen in the journey and why/how it impacts patient decisions
 - Would like to have stories from any members of STABLE and the research team who would be willing to share their story
 - Will be conducting focus groups early next year to collect patient stories; more information to come during the STABLE meeting



Data Interventions

- Ongoing meetings in process with the HIEA and Sheps for development of tools and launch
- Rachel and Jen meeting with OB colleagues for feedback on data collection and defining metrics (i.e., triggers/alerts)
- Will be asking practices for retrospective data on patients who delivered in 2021, on items like low birth weight, to provide a baseline from which to hopefully improve



ACURE4MOMS

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill has designed a study called ACURE4Moms to improve pregnancy outcomes and decrease health disparities. "ACURE" stands for "Accountability for Care through Undoing Racism and Equity."

ACURE4Moms is a randomized controlled trial that aims to improve maternal health outcomes, satisfaction, and communication, particularly for Black moms.


