

- Have done baseline data collection and will start analyzing the results soon




## Practice Engagement

Updated recruitment

44 sites!

Have recruited all our sites and they will be randomized before the end of the month!

- Stratifying based on region (East and West) and then by clinic volume (number of patients seen)
   Working with practices and UNC's Office of Industry
   Contracting (OIC) to set up agreements to officially enroll and onboard sites to the project
  - Created a Site Activation Checklist

- First time doulas from MVF and SC4S came together for a joint training!
- Reviewed the ACURE4Moms study and their roles within it
- Scheduling another virtual session in the winter to go over more research related information

Both MVF and SC4S are finalizing recruitment as practice randomization happens











## Maternal Health Equity Education Training

- Have completed a draft of MHEET Session 1
  - Plan to conduct the initial MHEET session 1s in February
- MAHEC is working on implicit bias simulation videos
  - Have finalized the provider video and are now working on other practice staff examples
- A team has been working on the Training of Trainers (ToT)
  - Includes Christina Yongue, Kimberly Alexander, Wanda Nicholson, and Jasmine Getrouw-Moore
  - Have identified our provider and community leads who will conduct the MHEET sessions
  - Plan to do the training end of January
- Working on an IRB submission for focus groups to collect patient stories for Birth Journey Diagram
  - Will share more information with STABLE members and the research team about participating in the coming weeks
- Developing topics and order of MHEET sessions based on original ACCURE study and our own timeline
  - MHEET session 2: Review Birth Journey Diagram (outlines a patient's journey through pregnancy and the individuals involved in care decisions)
  - MHEET session 3: Review patient stories collected from our focus groups







#### ACURE4MOMS

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill has designed a study called ACURE4Moms to improve pregnancy outcomes and decrease health disparities. "ACURE" stands for "Accountability for Care through Undoing Racism and Equity."

ACURE4Moms is a randomized controlled trial that aims to improve maternal health outcomes, satisfaction, and communication, particularly for Black moms.


