  - All simulation videos finished filming in mid-January
- Working on a manuscript of the ACURE4Moms protocol to submit to "The Green Journal" (*Obstetrics & Gynecology*) by February 1st

Our Founding President spoke with ABC11 WTVD about how Momma's Village Fayetteville is addressing these disparities through the #acure4moms research project along with UNC Chapel Hill addressing #pretermbirths and #lowbirthrates while addressing systemic racism within our medical community.

Although the overall rates declined in the state, Cumberland County still has a Black infant mortality that is over two times higher than non-Hispanic white birthing parents.






# Practice Engagement

Updated recruitment



- Have randomized 44 sites to our 4 research arms
- Finalized Data Use Agreement in late December
- Sent out Data Use Agreement and other paperwork to sites for review and signature so we can begin working with them
- Rural Health Group and Galations Community Health have sent back signed paperwork and we have begun their onboarding process







# Doula Interventions

SistasCaring4Sistas & Momma's Village Fayetteville

- Had our first Doula Research Training Retreat on 11/13/2022!
  - First time doulas from MVF and SC4S came together for a joint training!
  - Reviewed the ACURE4Moms study and their roles within it
- Scheduling monthly check-ins while we wait to start implementing interventions
- Both MVF and SC4S are finalizing recruitment now that we have randomization






# Maternal Healthcare Equity Education and Training

- Have completed a draft of MHEET Session 1
  - Plan to conduct the initial MHEET session 1s in March/April
- MAHEC finalized implicit bias simulation curriculum
  - Have finished filming all simulation videos (including front desk and nurse examples)
- Training of Trainers (ToT) team have developed a training for conducting MHEET sessions
  - First training held January 24<sup>th</sup>
  - Assigned provider leads and MHEET Community Trainers to practices receiving MHEET sessions
- Submitted IRB application for the focus groups to collect patient stories for the Pregnancy Journey Diagram
  - Will share more information with STABLE members and the research team about participating in the coming weeks
- Recruiting observers for the MHEET sessions
- Developed tentative structure of MHEET sessions based on original ACCURE study and our own timeline
  - **MHEET session 2:** Review Pregnancy Journey Diagram (outlines a patient's journey through pregnancy and the individuals involved in care decisions)
  - **MHEET session 3:** Review patient stories collected from our focus groups





## Data Interventions

- Scheduling meetings with Galations and Rural Health Group to discuss sending patient panels with necessary data for the Longitudinal Patient Survey, data extraction, and date intervention tools
- Ongoing meetings in process with the HIEA and Sheps for development of tools and launch
  - —Developing first two Maternal Early Warning System Alerts: High Blood Pressure and Missed Visits
- Rachel and Jen meeting with OB colleagues for feedback on data collection and defining metrics (i.e., triggers/alerts)

The plan is to start conducting preimplementation evaluations with practice staff in February/March 2023


April Valentine died January 10, 2023 giving birth to her Daughter at @centinelahospital in Inglewood, California.

April and her boyfriend complained for hours about her not being able to feel her legs. The nurses told them they could not call the doctor because the doctor would be "upset".

April was only 31 years old 💔 The age of my Black daughter who is currently 4 months pregnant with my 8th grandchild.

### ACURE4MOMS

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill has designed a study called ACURE4Moms to Improve pregnancy outcomes and decrease health dispartices. "ACURE" stands for "Accountability for Care through Undoing Racism and Equity."

ACURE4Moms is a randomized controlled trial that aims to improve maternal health outcomes, satisfaction, and communication, particularly for Black moms.
